NDRC Rules and Regulations

PLEASE READ THEM CAREFULLY THEY ARE FOR YOUR SAFETY

1. The Organisers and Norton & District Riding Club accept no responsibility for any accident, damage or injury to riders, spectators, horses or any other persons or property however caused.
2. **All competitors are required to hold a minimum of 3rd party liability insurance.**
3. Age to be taken from 1st January in the current season.
4. No pony/horse under 4 years of age will be eligible to compete in ridden classes.
5. Correct dress must be worn for appropriate classes. Please refer to dress code guidelines available on the website. **Riding hats to current BSI Standards must be worn when mounted. In-hand competitors aged 16 and under must wear hard hat.**
6. No cantering around the show field
7. Children to be supervised at all times.
8. Horses should not be left unsupervised when tied up to the outside of lorries or trailers.
9. No persons allowed in any ring unless with the authorisation of the ring steward.
10. No schooling whips are allowed in competition and misuse of whips and spurs may result in elimination. Whips need to measure between 45cm -75cm in length.
11. Any child entering lead rein must remain so ALL DAY unless in accordance with entered class rules.
12. All lead rein ponies in show classes must be in a snaffle bridle with lead rein attached to the noseband. Leaders must be a minimum of 16 years of age.
13. Spurs may not be worn by any competitor under 16 years of age within Showing or Working Hunter classes. Spurs are not permitted in **Veteran** classes. Spurs and whips may NOT be used in games.
14. Show Jumping classes faults are as follows; 4 for knockdown, 4 for refusal, 2nd refusal automatic elimination at which time you **MUST** retire from the ring. **If you fall in the ring, you must not remount or continue in that class.**
15. Competitors are responsible for being ready at the correct ring when required, if you are in another ring, please notify the entries secretary.
16. No refunds of entry monies at any event unless cancelled by the organisers.
17. All trophies are held for one year and must be returned by the date requested. Late returns WILL result in loss of deposit and may incur collection charges.
18. The Judge's decision is final in all respects.
19. Any objection must be made in writing with a £40 deposit within 15 minutes of the class ending. Objections submitted correctly will be investigated by the Committee whose decision will be final.
20. Any competitor using the Showground in such a way as to cause danger or hindrance to others will be asked to leave immediately.
21. **PLEASE TAKE YOUR LITTER HOME AND DOG OWNERS PLEASE COME EQUIPPED WITH A POOPER-SCOOPER. Dogs must be kept on a lead.**
22. All times are approximate. Not before time will be adhered to but classes may run later. Please keep an eye on your rings.
23. For measuring purposes 148cm (14.2) and below shall be classed as a pony, any animal above that height shall be classed as a Horse. The judge may ask for proof of height.
24. Late entries are at the discretion of the judge and a late entry slip must be produced.
25. Any stallions/colts must be ridden/handled by a competent person with a minimum age of 14 years. Stallions must be bitted, and stallions/colts must wear ID disc.
26. All horses and pony that attend our events must be vaccinated.

QUALIFIERS INFORMATION

Please read carefully and check the rules for each championship as they may differ to our club rules.



FOR CLUB MEMBERS ONLY: This Show is affiliated to STARS, taking place at Aintree Racecourse on the 21st - 24th November 2024. Qualification will be taken from points accrued over the season which give rise to our club champion, Reserve or 2nd Reserve for each relevant section across your year's competition marked in the schedule as STARS classes. The first option of representing the club will be offered to the Champion of each section. Should they be unable to attend will offer the place down to the Reserve and then the 2nd Reserve. Only these exhibitors/animals are eligible for qualification. Combination must stay the same for the championships as has competed at the club shows. **ONLY CLASSES MARKED STARS**

***PLEASE BE AWARE THE RACECOURSE IS RUNNING A 6 MONTH RULE FOR VACCINATION ***



This Show is affiliated to Equifest, taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 1st - 4th August 2024. The **two** highest placed eligible exhibits not already qualified in each affiliated class will qualify. Qualifier classes are marked **EQUIFEST**. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to obtain a qualification card prior to competing in an Equifest qualifier. Qualification cards can be obtained by downloading from the Equifest website.



This show is affiliated to Equine Sports UK (ESUK) Grassroots Championships taking place at Arena UK, Grantham, Lincolnshire on the 25th – 27th July 2024. The **three** highest placed exhibits will qualify in each class. Please print and bring qualification cards with you if you wish to qualify, we will have a limited number available on request.

This Show is affiliated to Concours d'Elegance Society GB. First, second and third placed horse/ponies not already qualified in eligible classes will qualify for the Champion of Britain Title classes to be held at Onley Equestrian Centre, Rugby, Warwickshire on the 24th – 25th August 2024. If a horse/pony has already qualified, cards may be handed down to 6th place at judge's discretion. Each qualified horse/pony will receive a qualification card in the ring which will enable the owner to enter the Championship Show, provided the owner and rider/handler are, or become registered with the Concours d'Elegance Society within 21 days of the qualifying show. Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. *This MUST be done within 21 days of qualification.* It is the competitor's responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK Lincolnshire on 30th August – 1st September 2024. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule which is available mid-season 2024.

Tattersalls RoR AMATEUR Ridden Show Series Qualifier 2024

Open to all RoR and NR competition registered horses, 4yrs and over, mares and geldings, owned, produced and ridden by an Amateur. Riders must be 15 years or over on the 1st January of the calendar year holding the classes. Horses should be ridden in a snaffle, Pelham or simple double bridle with a plain cavesson noseband. Horses should be plaited.

The Series is open to AMATEUR riders only – those employed in racing will be allowed to compete. Class will be judged under 'riding horse' format without 'type' being taken into consideration.

Racing injuries and blemishes ARE IGNORED in this series.

The Judge will not ride at the qualifiers but will ride in the Final.

Competitors/handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at the Hickstead Derby Meeting June 23rd 2024.

RoR rosettes 1st – 4th and a branded prize to the winner. The winner also qualifies for the Tattersalls RoR Amateur Ridden Show Series Special at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree on 24th August 2024. There is also a voucher for a RoR branded prize for the highest placed Veteran horse (15+) and qualification for the RoR Ridden Veteran Series Final at the Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree in August 2024. Vouchers to be redeemed from the RoR Office.

Amateur definition:

The rules are as in the rulebook with the following addition that an amateur may not show a horse owned or sponsored by a company or commercial firm. In addition, a person classed as amateur must not be supported by a company in any way or act as brand ambassador whether financially or in-kind. An amateur is a person who for the purpose of RoR classes does not/has not during the current season or previous season:

Engage (d) in breeding, livery, buying or selling, dealing or hiring horses in a commercial capacity. Horses must not have been stabled at or reside in a Professional Producer's/Trainer's yard from January 1st, 2023. Riders must not have ridden any animals produced by a Professional/Trainer in the current or previous season. Horses and riders must not receive any help from a Professional Producer/Trainer at a SHOW in the current season. A rider who has ridden for a Professional/Producer Trainer in the current or previous season must not have ridden horses at a show. Any breaches of this ruling will be taken seriously and will result in disqualification from future classes.

Tattersalls RoR OPEN In Hand Show Series Qualifier 2024

Open to all RoR and NR **competition registered** horses, 3yrs and over, fillies, mares and geldings.

Horses do not need to be shod to compete in the RoR Open In-Hand class.

Horses can be shown in a bitless/In-Hand Bridle. Blemishes caused through racing will be ignored.

All those entering horses and/or participating in the show agree to be bound by the Retraining of Racehorses Rules and Regulations from time to time in force.

Handlers/grooms must wear a safety/kite mark hard hat with a chinstrap.

The first three go forward to the final at The Jockey Club RoR National Championships at Aintree, August 24th 2024.

RoR rosettes 1st – 4th and a branded prize to the winner. Prize to be redeemed from the RoR Office.

Open to plaited and M&M ponies. Rider not to have attained their 12th birthday before January 1st in the current year. Ponies not to exceed 128cms. Snaffle bridles only. No group canter.

*Highest placed M&M and highest placed plaited to qualify **Please state M&M or Plaited when entering***

Class 5 – Ridden Mountain and Moorland *STARS,ESUK,EQUIFEST* KINDLY SPONSORED BY JAMES BLACK Dipwcf – REGISTERED FARRIER

Rider any age. Open to all small and large M&M breed types: Shetland, Dartmoor, Welsh Sections A&B, Exmoor, Fells, Dales, Highlands, New Forest, Welsh Sections C&D and Connemara. Any suitable bridle. Class maybe split if sufficient entries *Highest placed small and highest placed large to qualify. **Please state small or large when entering***

Class 6 – Ridden Pony *STARS,ESUK,EQUIFEST*

Rider any age. Open to all plaited ponies not exceeding 148cms and all plaited show hunter ponies not exceeding 153cms. Any suitable bridles. No LR. *Highest placed show pony and show hunter pony to qualify. **Please state type when entering***

Class 7 – Ridden Veteran *VHS,SSADL,STARS,ESUK,EQUIFEST*

Open to any height horse or pony 15years and over including LR. Open to horses and ponies of any breed and height. Any suitable bridle. No Spurs to be worn. No gallop in show. This class will be judged as one, then the highest placed in the relevant three age categories will qualify. Please see the relevant societies rules for further information. ***Please state age when entering***

Class 8 – In hand Coloured Open Horse or Pony *CHAPS,STARS,ESUK,EQUIFEST*

Open to any height. To be plaited, Native, Cob and Traditional hogged or natural. Please state horse or pony when entering class. **STARS (Highest placed pony and horse to represent)**

Class 9 – In hand Re-trained Racehorse *ROR QUAILFIER 21st APRIL – RoR Pre Entry Only. PLEASE REFER TO PAGE 5 FOR RULES AND ELIGIBILITY, ESUK*

Horse must have been in training or raced and be registered with Weatherby's.

Lead rein to be attached directly between the noseband and the leader's hand only. Highest placed lead rein to qualify and highest placed first ridden to qualify. Please state LR or FR when entering

Equitation classes to be judged as follows:
50% Riders use of seat and aids,
25% Riders position,
25% suitability of partnership and overall impression.

Class 19 - Concours d'Elegance In hand (19th May, 7th July & 11th August Only) – ***CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE SOCIETY GB,ESUK***

Class to be judged on elegance and overall aesthetic appearance. Please see www.eqconcoursegb.com for rules. Competitors aged 16 and under must wear hard hat.

Class 20 – Ridden Novice Horse or Pony ***ESUK***

This is for **young, novice and nervous horses or ponies** not necessarily a novice rider. Walk and trot only in go round. Canter is optional in individual show. Snaffle bridle only.

Not Before 10.00am

Class 21 - Concours d'Elegance Ridden (19th May, 7th July & 11th August Only) – ***CONCOURS D'ELEGANCE SOCIETY GB,ESUK***

Class to be judged on elegance and overall aesthetic appearance. Please see www.eqconcoursegb.com for rules. Open to all ridden horses and ponies including LR. Hard hats to the current safety standard must be worn by all competitors, this is a venue rule by which we must abide.

Class 22 - Senior Handler

Open to handlers aged 18 years and over. Horse or pony any height.

Class 23 - Tiny Tots Handler ***STARS***

Handlers 4 to 7 years of age (Handlers to have attained their 4th birthday but not to attained their 7th birthday before 1st January in the current year) Handlers must be accompanied by an adult in the ring but the adult may not assist with the handling of the pony unless the handler is in difficulty

Class 24 - Novice Rider Showing *ESUK*

This is for genuine **novice and/or nervous riders**. Any age. Walk and trot only in go round. Canter is optional in individual show. Snaffle bridle only. Combinations are excluded for all other ridden showing class.

Class 25 - Young Handler & Junior Handler *STARS,ESUK*

Young handlers to have attained their 8th birthday but not their 12th birthday before 1st January in current year. Junior handlers to have received their 12th birthday but not their 18th birthday before the 1st of January in the current year. Horse or pony any height. **Please state Young or Junior when entering*** Highest placed Young to qualify and highest placed Junior to qualify.

Class 26 - Junior/ Senior Equitation *STARS*

Equitation classes to be judged as follows:
50% Riders use of seat and aids,
25% Riders position,
25% suitability of partnership and overall impression.

Junior rider not to have attained their 18th birthday and Senior riders to have attained their 18th birthday before 1st January in the current year. Horse/Pony any height. **Snaffle bridles only**. Highest placed Junior to qualify and highest placed Senior .Please state Junior or Senior when entering.
